

Vaccination Requirements:

DPP (Distemper, Parvovirus & Parainfluenza) 1 or 3-yr.

Bordetella

Oral (inner nasal) Bordetella vaccination Required, at least 7 days prior to check-in (or 14 days if not had it before) to ensure maximum efficiency & protection against upper respiratory illnesses. Please note: many veterinarians administer this vaccine only by request, Annual updates are required thereafter.

Rabies 1 or 3-yr. vaccine required.

Canine Influenza is Not required, but highly recommended to help protect against Canine Influenza respiratory illness. Consult your veterinarian.

Leptospirosis Not required, but highly recommended to help protect against the Leptospirosis infection. Consult your veterinarian.

Fleas & ticks In addition to vaccinations, all dogs should be flea and tick free. Campers with signs of fleas and/or ticks will be treated at a Grooming Salon at the pet parent's expense.

*** All vaccinations must be up to date and proof shown upon first visit to our facility yearly thereafter:

(IF your dog is not up to date for any reason please contact the farm for Clarification, exceptions or if you have any concerns.)

vaccinations

Vaccinations must be administered at least 48 hours prior to arrival under the guidance of a licensed veterinarian. However, we prefer vaccinations be administered 10 days before check-in.

Spaying/Neutering Requirements: All Dogs are required to be fixed by the age of 9 month (please Call the farm for clarification, you're unsure or have concerns)

What Our Guests Should Bring: Please bring your pets food preferably in portioned containers like zip lock bags or in original packaging (please bring scoop if not portioning), and any special feeding items or medication, Toys beds and small blankets that are machine washable are welcome. It is not necessary to bring feeding/water bowls as we have plenty (unless they require a special slow feeder).

We do not give rawhide treats or pigs' ears. Please, no glass containers or bowls.
Medication: Our trained staff can administer medication.
